During the eighth century, an unknown poet wrote a prayer asking God to be his Vision, his Wisdom, and his Best Thought by day or by night. This is one of our oldest hymns!

Be Thou my vision, O Lord of my heart, Naught be all else to me save that Thou art. Thou my best thought by day or by night, Waking of Sleeping, Thy presence my light.

This writer was likely influenced by St. Patrick, a most famous missionary to Ireland. Born in 373 AD, Patrick became a most prolific evangelist, planting around 200 churches and baptizing one hundred thousand new Christians. This text was set to a traditional Irish folk song named Slane, which was the area in Ireland where Patrick was reported as spreading the gospel.

Riches I heed not, nor vain, empty praise, Thou mine inheritance, now and always; Thou and thou only first in my heart, High King of heaven, my treasure thou art.

The best and strongest truth comes from our Lord Jesus. The Spirit of God gives us our best thoughts when we sense his presence.
