How big of a thing can it be to have one extra club in your golf bag? Ask Ian Woosnam of Wales that question. He began the final round of the 2001 British Open just one stroke off the lead. He birdied the first hole, giving him a share of the lead. But then, his caddie noticed that he had two drivers in his bag. Woosnam had been hitting two drivers on the practice tee, trying to decide which one he would use for the round. Since the first hole was a par three, he had not used his driver. So, it was on the second hole that he discovered the extra club in his bag. What was the consequence of this oversight? Ian was given a two-stroke penalty. As a result, Ian ended the day—and the tournament—in a six-way tie for third place.

But what was the real consequence of this oversight? Without the twostroke penalty, Ian Woosnam would have been alone second place in the tournament. The difference between being in second place and in a sixway tie for third was \$312,000! Little things do make a difference.

I'd like to challenge you to decide what one little thing you could do to make a big difference in someone's life in the coming days. Why not offer prayer support? Why don't you reach out and make contact with someone or a family you have missed at worship? Why not invite a neighbor or friend that has been on your heart lately? What about doing or giving a little something special to a friend or special person in your life?

I also think it would be a great time for us to figure out how we could honor our Lord and His church. You could give to the church out of the blessings that God has given you. You could pick out someone who needs some extra help and do it for them. However, or whatever, God lays upon your heart, please don't let the opportunity go to waste!

We all have been so touched by God! May we never be guilty of not using all the clubs in our bag!


