We have lived with the phrase, "your actions will speak louder than your words." Many would think that doesn't apply to our spiritual lives, but it truly does. The most evident problem for Christians today is not that we do evil, but that we do nothing at all. We're like the lady on whose tombstone was written these words:

Here lie the bones of Nancy Jones. For her, life held no terrors. She lived an old maid. She died an old maid. No hits, no runs, no errors!

The greatest challenge facing us today is to get out of the passive voice into the active voice. We His Church must become doers of the word rather than hearers only. One of the greatest examples of such action can be found in the life of Daniel. His enemies in the court wanted to disgrace him. So, they convinced King Darius to sign a decree that only allowed worship to him for 30 days and no one else. His enemies watched him like a hawk to see what he would do.

Daniel did three simple things. His actions need to become part of our lives and work within the church:

- Daniel acted calmly. He entered his house to pray and give thanks before God. He acted without hesitation. He moved into the active voice. Sometimes the calm action like Daniel's shows that God is in control.
- Daniel acted courageously. He knew about the King's declaration. He was totally aware of the consequences of his actions. But Daniel still prayed and gave thanks before God. When all is going smoothly, we feel safe. Sometimes we Christians need to become the brave ones and react to what is happening around us.
- Daniel acted consistently. Scripture says that he just did what he had previously been doing. The greatest key to getting out of the passive voice in our service to God is consistency.

My prayer for All of us within CBC is to act calmly, courageously, and consistently for God to move us out of the passive voice into the active voice of following God in this new year.
