And for me, that is so sad.

They're not mad nor afraid. They're just indifferent as to whether they should return to church or not. I'd like to think they have assessed their lives and decided that attending church wasn't that important in the end. Believe me that is discouraging to say the least, but there is a lesson for all of us.

It's time we all look at our passion for Christ and the church. The mission of the church gets accomplished as well or better outside the walls of the church. Maybe it is time we start thinking beyond the building! I think it is time we start to focus not so much on gathering as we should shift our focus to sending and connecting. May God help us find the new ways needed to renew our congregation's passion for Christ and the people who need Him.

Well, back in the 5th century, Maewyn Succat (St Patrick's real name) had to make some pretty big choices.
