



### ♫ From Your Music Minister ♫

Isaac Watts, known as the "Father of English Hymnody" penned the text of *Joy to the World, the Lord is Come.* Watts was the author of nearly 700 hymns and psalm paraphrases. He was inspired from the spirit of God and the theology of the Scripture. He created a Christian approach to the singing of the Hebrew psalms. *Joy to the World* was inspired from Psalm 98, especially verses 4-9.

<sup>4</sup> Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth, burst into jubilant song with music;
<sup>5</sup> make music to the Lord with the harp, with the harp and the sound of singing,
<sup>6</sup> with trumpets and the blast of the ram's horn—shout for joy before the Lord, the King.
<sup>7</sup> Let the sea resound, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it.
<sup>8</sup> Let the rivers clap their hands, let the mountains sing together for joy;
<sup>9</sup> let them sing before the Lord, for he comes to judge the earth. He will judge the world in righteousness and the peoples with equity.

Some have considered this hymn as a preparation of the second coming of Jesus. One denomination even changed the verb to read, Joy to the world, the Lord will come. Because it was written by Watts with Psalm 98 in mind, I think this hymn could be and should be sung year round. Our preparations this season should include expressing joy in worship, preparing our hearts for Jesus to rule more, as we view Him as the Christ child, Savior, and coming King.

Joy to the world, the Lord is come Let earth receive her King Let every heart prepare Him room And Heaven and nature sing!



Our sanctuary is filled with symbols at Christmas time. The advent candles. The evergreen wreaths and garlands. The Christmas tree. The nativity. And even the poinsettias are symbolic. The shape reminds us of the star of Bethlehem – and to celebrate Christ's birth. And the red color reminds us of His sacrifice on the cross. There is a wonderful legend about the poinsettia in Mexican folklore. A poor girl named Pepita was very sad because she had no present to offer baby Jesus at the Christmas Eve service.
